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I. Background

1. The Government of Indonesia (Gol) is implementing the Geothermal Power Generation Project. The project includes the construction and commissioning of a 55 MW geothermal power plant at Dieng, Wonosobo Regency, Central Java Province, and a 55 MW geothermal power plant at Patuha, Pasirjambu, Bandung Regency, West Java Province. (See **Figure I-1** for the project location map). The subproject at Dieng is commonly referred to as Dieng 2, while the subproject at Patuha is commonly referred to as Patuha 2.

2. The project is envisaged to (a) increase the contribution of geothermal energy to the country's power supply, in addition to expanding the role of renewable energy in the power sector; (b) improve the capacity of PT Geo Dipa Energi (GDE) to plan, develop, and operate geothermal power plants; and (c) enhance GDE's Community Development Program, a corporate commitment where the company initiates socioeconomic undertakings for communities where GDE operates.

3. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) is supporting the project through Loan 3928-INO (SF).¹ PT Geo Dipa Energi, a state-owned geothermal company, is the executing agency (EA), assisted by a project management unit (PMU). A project management consultant (PMC) provides technical assistance to the PMU in carrying out its project management functions.

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II. Description of the Subprojects

4. Both Dieng 2 and Patuha 2 include (a) drilling of new wells for the production and reinjection of reservoir fluids, and (ii) construction of an aboveground steam gathering system and fluid reinjection lines connecting the wells and generating units. Patuha Unit 2 is a single-flash power plant, i.e., steam is separated and used as the working fluid for the power plant, while the water is unused and reinjected in the reservoir along with the condensate from the steam cycle. On the other hand, Dieng Unit 2 is a geothermal combined cycle plant, i.e., steam and water are separated, but the heat energy from the steam is used twice, and the heat energy from the water is used once before reinjection.

A. Dieng 2

5. In addition to a power plant, the subproject will construct a transmission line to connect the power plant with an existing substation of the state-owned electric corporation Perusahaan Listrik Negara (PLN).² No new well pads will be developed, but 10 new wells (i.e., 4 production wells, 5 injection wells, and 1 contingency well) will be drilled on existing well pads of Dieng 1. Table overleaf summarizes the anticipated land acquisition and resettlement (LAR) impacts of the various components of Dieng 2.

6. The facilities of Dieng 2 are in the villages of Karangtengah, Kepakisan, and Dieng Kulon, Batur Subdistrict, Wonosobo District; in the village of Sikunang, Kejajar Subdistrict, Banjarnegara District; and in the village of Pranten, Bawang Subdistrict, Batang District.




Figure II-1 Layout of Dieng 2 Subproject Components

³ At project processing in 2019, pad 38 was being considered as the location for the Dieng 2 power plant. A resettlement plan (RP) was prepared which ADB cleared for implementation in November 2019. The RP covered, among others, the resettlement of 23 informal cultivators and 4 "coordinators" who tilled vegetable plots at pad 38, a property of GDE. Clearing of pad 38 was carried out following payment of compensation for income loss to the APs on 7 October 2020.

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B. Patuha 2

- 7. In addition to a power plant, Patuha 2 consists of the following components:
 - a. Drilling of 12 new wells: 9 new wells to be drilled at existing well pads, i.e., well pad 4 at Location G, well pad 5 (Location W), well pad 7 (Location V), and well pad 6 (Location U); and 3 new well pads (i.e., PTH 9, PTH 9A, and PTH 9B) to be drilled at Location BB.
 - b. Construction of new steam pipelines: connecting well pad 9, well pad 4, and the new power plant; and connecting well pad 5, well pad 7, well pad 6, and the new power plant. Construction of a condensate line from the new power plant to well pad 1 (Loc A).
 - c. Installation of additional transformer at existing Patuha Substation approximately 200 m from the new power plant

8. The facilities of Patuha 2 are in Panundaan Village, Ciwidey Subdistrict; Alamendah Village, Rancabali Subdistrict; and Sugihmukti Village, Pasir Jambu Subdistrict. These places are all within the administrative jurisdiction of Bandung Regency.


9. Except for Location BB, the Patuha 2 power plant and ancillary facilities will be constructed inside GDE property that presently includes Patuha 1. GDE in January 2021 acquired by lease agreement (*Izin Pinjam Pakai Kawasan Hutan* or IPPKH) with the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (MOEF) approximately 2.82 ha of protected forestland at Location BB. Per MOEF Regulation No. 7 Year 2019, GDE had to acquire twice the size of the 2.82 ha forestland it got and to hand this over to MOEF which Perum Perhutani would develop and manage as a protected forest.

10. The MOEF in letter number S.378/Menlhk-PKTL/REN/Pla.0/3/2022, dated 14 March 2022, approved the proposal of GDE to replace the 2.82 ha forest land it got from Perum Perhutani with 6.07 ha of contiguous plantation plots located at Sugihmukti Village. Twenty-seven households were affected (i.e., affected households or AHs) by the loss of 29 contiguous plots.⁴

III. Objectives of Internal Monitoring

11. The April 2020 Project Administration Manual (PAM) and the November 2019 Dieng 2 Subproject resettlement plan (RP) mandate the PMU, with support from PMC, to internally monitor the implementation of land acquisition and resettlement (LAR).⁵ The results of internal monitoring are summarized in a social monitoring report (SMR) that GDE submits semiannually to ADB for review and acceptance prior to its posting on GDE and ADB websites.

12. Internal monitoring is intended to check on whether the objectives of resettlement are met. Specifically, internal monitoring looks into the following concerns:

- a. Compensation payments to all AHs in various categories have been completed according to the compensation policy described in the RP.
- b. Delivery of livelihood restoration program and social support entitlements.
- c. Public information dissemination and consultations procedures.
- d. Adherence to the grievance procedures and resolution of outstanding issues requiring management's attention.
- e. Benefits provided by the project.
- f. Ability of the AHs to re-establish their livelihoods and living standards.

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IV. Scope and Methodology

13. This semi-annual social monitoring report (SSMR) covers the period July-December 2023. It should be read in conjunction with the January-June 2023 SSMR. Information for this report came mainly from (a) monitoring and supervision activities carried out by the PMU, assisted by PMC, at Dieng 2 and Patuha 2; (b) due diligence and needs assessment reports prepared during the period; (c) tracking the closure of outstanding concerns in the previous SSMR; and (d) actions taken on issues flagged during the October 2023 ADB loan review mission.

V. Highlights of the January-June 2023 SSMR

14. Sections below discuss the status of outstanding (i.e., carried over from July-December 2022) and new land acquisition and resettlement (LAR) concerns that cropped up in January-June 2023.

A. Dieng 2 Subproject

1. Resolved in January-June 2023

15. <u>Addendum to the 2021 Dieng 2 RP</u>. ADB on 18 January 2023 cleared the Addendum resettlement plan (RP) for implementation and posted it on the ADB website the same day. PMU on 26 January 2023 handed over the top-up compensation of the landowner AHs of pad 7 and pad 9 at the respective homes.

16. **Outstanding Grievances of 2022**. Complaints lodged in December 2022 by farmers Sarman, Tuyono, and Mukholik⁶ from Karangtengah Village in connection with well-testing activities at SLR-T-9C were resolved on 10 March 2023 during a meeting organized by the PMU; the contractor agreed to compensate the farmers for damages to their potato crops. Relatedly, the complaint lodged in September 2022 by Mr. Aman Sasono concerning damage to his potato crop due to mud flow during drilling activities at pad 7 was resolved on 16 February 2023 when the contractor recompensed the aggrieved farmer for the damages. The complaint raised in October 2022 by Mr. Sobirin concerning the dumping of spoils from pad 33 into a river at Bitingan Sub-village that damaged the farmer's crop was likewise resolved on 16 February 2023 when the contractor recompensed the farmer for damages.

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2. Ongoing/Unresolved LAR Concerns (January-June 2023)

17. **Dieng 2 Power Plant RP at Pad 12**. The construction of the power plant requires the expansion of up to ± 3.55 ha the current ± 0.77 ha land area of pad 12. The expansion of the area of pad 12 will require a new lease agreement or IPPKH with the Ministry of Environment and forestry. Since the expansion of pad 12 involves the displacement of 27 informal cultivators, an RP must be prepared and implemented. PMC during the semester carried out the following activities in connection with the preparation of the RP: (i) submitted for PMU approval on 23 March 2023 a work plan for preparing the RP (See **Appendix 1** for the indicative schedule of RP preparation and implementation); (ii) submitted in May 2023 for PMU approval a draft public information booklet (PIB); (iii) met with the 27 informal cultivators on 7 June 2023 at Sikunang Village Hall to discuss the need for a detailed measurement survey (DMS) of their affected assets, including gathering of socioeconomic information on the cultivators' households; (iv) conducted on 9 June 2023 a cadastral survey and DMS of plots and vegetations on the ± 2.78 ha expansion area of pad 12; and, (v) gathered on 12 - 15 June 2023 socioeconomic information on the households of the 27 cultivators. By the end of June 2023, the RP has yet to be written.

18. <u>DDR for Dieng 2 Additional Components</u>. PMC on 19 June 2023 submitted to PMU the DDR which concluded that (i) LAR did not occur in GDE's acquisition and development of well pad 14, well pad 15, well pad 17, well pad 18, well pad 29, well pad 32, well pad 33, staging pad 28, booster pump, and temporary office; and (ii) LAR is not anticipated to occur in the use by Dieng 2 of the same facilities. ADB has yet to give its concurrence to the DDR as of the end of June 2023.

19. <u>Livelihood Restoration Program</u>. PMC in June 2023 submitted to PMU a list of the preferred LRP activities of members of the households of the 23 cultivators displaced in October 2020 from pad 38. The implementation of the LRP piggybacks on the Community Development (COMDEV), GDE's socioeconomic development program for residents of villages where Dieng 1 and Dieng 2 operate. While PMU and PMC hoped to implement the chosen LRP activities of pad 38 activities in the second half of 2023, the January-June 2023 SSMR has noted that the LRP lacks a framework with clear purpose and direction.

20. **Grievance**. While the previous SSMR reported that there was no grievance raised in Dieng 2, it was belatedly learned that there were in fact 8 complaints lodged during January-June 2023. A complaint was lodged on 11 January 2023 related to the water pollution at Kepakisan due to the activity in Pad 29. PMU repaired the leak and on 8 February 2023 conducted a meaningful consultation with the complainant. A complaint lodged on 9 May 2023 concerning damage to the irrigation pipe of a farmer at Karangtengah Village was resolved on 31 May 2023 by providing a 100-meter pipe to replace the broken irrigation pipe of the complainant. Six complaints lodged in June 2023 alleged that that the transport by the civil works contractor of heavy drilling equipment to pad 30 on the Pawuhan Hamlet public road damaged their houses. These 6 complaints of

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residents from Pawuhan Hamlets were not acted on by the end of June 2023. (See **Appendix 2** for a list of the 6 complaints of Pawuhan residents filed in June 2023).

21. The January-June 2023 SSMR acknowledged that project personnel's failure to report, address, and track the resolution of complaints was indicative that the GRM was not functioning as intended. APs and other stakeholders were not adequately informed of the GRM process. Also, complaints lodged at the project site and actions taken to address and resolve them were not systematically logged and tracked at various levels of the GRM (i.e., project site level, PMU Dieng 2 level, and PMU Office at Soreang). The PMU site focal person and social safeguard staff are the only ones who hold copies of the GRM complaint form.

22. <u>March 2023 ADB Loan Review Mission</u>. PMC actively took part in the 13-21 March 2023 ADB Loan Review Mission. Specific to social safeguard, PMC on 13 March 2023 briefed the mission on the status of LAR, public communication, and gender concerns and activities at Dieng 2. Likewise, PMC joined the site inspections of various Dieng 2 facilities. Agreed actions on social safeguards are consolidated with those of the September-October 2023 ADB loan review mission, and the status of these actions as of December 2023 is included in **section VI.B.2** of this report.

23. **Public Consultation and Communication**. This is a continuing LAR activity until project completion. As reported in the January-June 2023 SSMR, 54 public consultations and coordination meetings were held. A total of 660 persons participated, including 116 women and 544 men. The consultations and meetings were conducted in an open atmosphere in connection with various project activities during the semester.

24. **External Monitoring Agency**. PMC in March and April 2023 reviewed and suggested revisions to the first and second drafts of the external monitoring agency's report.

B. Patuha 2 Subproject

1. Resolved in January-June 2023

25. **DDR for Patuha 2 Additional Components**. PMC on 20 January 2023 submitted to PMU a revised version of the DDR based on the comments of ADB. The DDR for Patuha 2 additional components was cleared and posted by ADB on its website on 16 February 2023.

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26. <u>**Grievance Lodged in January-June 2023**</u>. Four grievances were lodged during the period; one concerned non-payment of the salary of a laborer on 9 May 2023, a grievance related to compensation for damages of the village road drainage arising from the activities of the contractor on 15 May 2023. Similarly, 2 queries were raised on 10 May 2023; one concerned information about social package for Ramadhan and the other concerned information on GDE's geothermal project. All complaints and queries were resolved during the semester.

2. Ongoing/Unresolved LAR Concerns (January-June 2023)

27. <u>DDR on the Replacement Forestland</u>. PMC on 22 June 2023 revised the DDR per comments by ADB. The revised DDR was re-submitted to PMU on 27 June 2023. Earlier on 25 May 2023 at Sugihmukti Village, PMU met with the 27 AH heads and explained to them that GDE hoped to find a way to refund taxes deducted from their compensation without violating government tax regulations. The 27 AH heads understood the predicament of PMU and agreed to receive their tax refunds in kind. PMU hoped to deliver the tax refunds in July 2023. (See **Appendix 3** for details of the in-kind tax refunds chosen by the AH).

28. <u>Livelihood Restoration Program</u>. No livelihood restoration program (LRP) was carried out for the 27 landowner AHs, farm lessee, and 2 farm workers displaced from the 6.07 ha replacement forestland at Sugihmukti Village. PMC in June 2023 submitted to PMU a list of the preferred COMDEV social support activities⁷ of the 27 landowner AHs. PMU and PMC hoped to implement the chosen social support activities in the second half of 2023

29. **Public Consultation and Communication**. This is a continuing LAR activity until project completion. The January-June 2023 SSMR reported that 13 public consultations and coordination meetings were held in connection with various project activities during the period. A total of 246 persons participated, including 87 women and 159 men.

30. <u>ADB Loan Review Mission</u>. PMC joined site inspections of various Patuha 2 facilities during the 13-21 March 2023 ADB Loan Review Mission. Agreed actions on social safeguards are

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consolidated with those of the September-October 2023 ADB loan review mission, and the status of these actions as of December 2023 is included in **section VI.C.2** of this report.

VI. LAR Implementation in July-December 2023

31. The following sections discuss (a) staffing and work assignments of the social safeguard team, (b) the status of outstanding LAR concerns reported in the January-June 2023 SSMR, (c) continuing and on-going LAR activities undertaken in July-December 2023, and (d) unfinished LAR activities to be carried over for completion in January-June 2024.

A. Social Safeguard Team as of July-December 2023

32. The national social safeguard specialist, whose contract ended on 30 November 2023, opted not to extend her services for the project. AECOM has not initiated any action to find a replacement for the national social safeguard specialist. Even before the end of the national social safeguard specialist's contract, fieldwork and data gathering needed in preparing social safeguard deliverables during the second half of 2023 were undertaken by 2 national gender expert assistants who double as social safeguard assistants. Another national specialist was on hand to assist on matters concerning consultations and the GRM.

33. The PMC HSSE Coordinator opted not to extend his contract which ended on 30 November 2023. Relatedly, the contract of the international social safeguard specialist ends on 31 January 2024. As of end of December 2023, AECOM has not yet initiated any discussion with the international social safeguard specialist on possible contract extension.

B. Dieng 2

1. LAR Activities Carried-over from the January-June 2023 SSMR

34. <u>**Dieng 2 Power Plant RP at Pad 12**</u>. PMC on 31 August 2023 submitted to PMU the first draft of the RP based on the DMS done on 9 June 2023, the socioeconomic survey on 12 - 15 June 2023, the replacement cost study on 14-15 July 2023, and the disclosure meeting with the AHs on 10 August 2023. ADB on 19 September gave its comments to the draft RP which included, among others, the need to hold another disclosure meeting with the AHs to ensure that all 27 informal cultivators were thoroughly briefed on project impacts and entitlements, and to include in the revised RP a (i) bespoke GRM for Dieng 2 to improve its functionality; (ii) revised project information booklet (PIB) that incorporates the salient aspects of the improved GRM in addition to the project resettlement policy; and (iii) framework of the LRP for pad 12 AHs.

35. PMU and PMC on 13 November 2023 at the house of the chief of Siterus Hamlet met with the AHs and discussed project impacts, entitlements, and the improved GRM. Eighteen of the 27 affected informal cultivators were present and they, along with village officials, were provided copies of the revised PIB (see **Appendix 4** or a copy of the revised PIB). PMC on 14-15 November 2023, visited the remaining 9 AHs at their respective homes and briefed them on project impacts,

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entitlements, and the improved GRM. They were also given a copy of the revised PIB. (See **Ap-pendix 5** for the minutes of the 13 November public meeting at Siterus Hamlet). Moreover, PMC carried out needs assessment for the LRP (see para 38 below) with each of the 10 AHs at their respective homes.

36. PMC on 29 November 2023 submitted to PMU the revised RP. As of the end of December 2023, ADB has not yet given its feedback to the revised RP.

37. **DDR for Dieng 2 Additional Components**. ADB on 20 October 2023 cleared the DDR for posting on the Bank's website.

38. Livelihood Restoration Program. PMC on 13-17 November 2023 held in-depth interviews of eligible AHs of pad 12, pad 7, pad 9, and pad 38 to assess their socioeconomic needs and tentatively identify their LRP activities. For Dieng 2 pad 12 AHs (power plant), needs assessment and planning were first conducted on 13 November 2023 at the house of the chief of Siterus Hamlet for 17 participants, then on 14-15 November 2023 at the individual homes of the remaining 10 AHs who were not available earlier. Needs assessment and planning interviews of pad 7 AHs were carried out on 15 November at the house of the affected landowner Ibu Hardati, while the same were carried out for pad 9 AHs at the house of the affected landowner Ibu Manisem on 16 November 2023. On the other hand, PMC, on 16-17 November 2023 conducted needs assessment and planning interviews of each of the 11 participating AHs of pad 38 (i.e., 2019 Dieng 2 RP) at their respective homes in Krajan Hamlet, Karangtengah Village.

39. Subsequent to the needs assessment and planning exercises, standalone LRP documents were prepared each for pad 12, pad 7 and 9, and pad 38 AHs.⁸ PMC submitted the following LRP frameworks for eligible Dieng 2 AHs: pad 12 on 23 November 2023, Pad 7 and Pad 9 on 18 December 2023, and Pad 38 on 28 December 2023.

40. **Complaints**. The 6 complaints lodged in June 2023 (see para 20) by residents of Pawuhan Hamlet in connection with the transport of heavy drilling equipment to and from pad 30 increased to 18 by the end of August 2023. Aggrieved households reported their complaints to the project site-based PR (public relations) social safeguards supervisor or through text messaging/call to the Halo Dieng. In the process of filling-up and signing the GRM form, the GRM social safeguards focal point along with a civil engineer of PMC visited the house of each aggrieved resident. The civil engineer examined the cracks in the house, took pictures of the same, and noted on a prepared investigation form whether the damages appeared recent (therefore attributable to the transport of heavy equipment as alleged) or not.

⁸ Pad 38 is not included in the LRP prepared for AHs (farm workers) of pad 7 and pad 9. It was learned during the interview of the 3 farm workers that the 2021 Dieng 2 RP erred in reporting that they were displaced from pad 38. The 3 farm workers were in 2021 and to date still working for Pak Kholifin on his other farmland across the road from pad 30.

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41. PMU's Dieng 2 HSSE superintendent, the contractor (PT. Plumpang Raya Anugrah), and representatives of Forkompinca⁹ on 23 August 2023 and 30 August 2023 at the Dieng 2 Temporary Office met with the aggrieved AHs to discuss the steps to be taken to resolve their complaints. With the exception of 1 AH¹⁰ whose complaint was resolved on 19 July 2023, the remaining 17 aggrieved AHs showed up during those meetings (See **Appendix 7** for a complete list of the 18 aggrieved parties).

42. It was agreed in the 23 and 30 August 2023 meetings that the contractor and representatives from the Forkompinca on 12 September 2023 would visit each of the aggrieved AHs to negotiate the amount of compensation for their damaged house. The contractor averred during the 23 and 30 August 2023 meetings that it would bring any unresolved case to the grievance redress committee (GRC)¹¹ for adjudication if agreement could not be reached during the house visit.

43. As discussed in the 23 and 30 August 2023 meetings, representatives of the contractor and Forkopimca on 12 September 2023 visited each of the 17 AHs at their homes to negotiate on an acceptable cash compensation. At the conclusion of the negotiation, the contractor's representative handed over the compensation of the AH before going to the house of the next complainant. The contractor and the 17 AHs reached mutually acceptable amounts of compensation. Each of the 17 AHs, along with the contractor's representative, signed a *Berita Acara Penyelesaian* as evidence of the resolution of their complaint. (See **Appendix 8** for a few samples of a signed GRM form, including investigation report, photos of house damages, and *Berita Acara Penyelesaian* or statement on the resolution of the case).

44. Following the 2-10 October 2023 ADB loan review mission, PMC prepared and submitted to PMU an improved GRM to enhance the mechanism's functionality. As of the end of 2023, GDE has yet to issue a decree affirming the upgraded GRM. (See **Appendix 9** for an overview of the improved GRM).

45. On 1-6 November 2023, a total of 13 farmers filed complaints alleging that well testing activities at pad SLR-T-9C damaged their potato farms. The contractor (Depriwangga), PMU, and the chief of Karangtengah Village on 6 November 2023 met to discuss ways to resolve the complaints. Subsequently on 14-15 November 2023, personnel from the Penyuluh Pertaninan

⁹ This is a local government body formed by virtue of Republic of Indonesia Law 23 of 2014 on Regional Government which serves as a forum for coordination and cooperation between the civil government, the police, and the military. Members of Forkompinca are the district chief (*camat*) as chairperson, and representatives of the police and the military in the sub-district as members.

¹⁰ One AH, headed by Pak Ma'ruf, on 17 July 2023 complained that the concrete fishpond in his porch was damaged during the transport of heavy equipment to pad 30. Based on the results of the inspection of his house on 18 July 2023, Pak Ma'ruf on 19 July 2023 agreed to receive bags of cements from the contractor to repair his damaged porch. 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Lapangan or PPL (Field Agriculture Office), accompanied by PMU, the contractor, and the Rojimur Team, carried out field investigation and assessment of damages to the potato farms. The investigating team met again on 27-28 November 2023 to discuss their findings.

46. The PMU, contractor, and the Rojimur Team on 27 December 2023 at the Dieng Temporary Office met with the 13 farmers to present the results of the investigation and assessment of the damages to their crops. Of the 13 aggrieved farmers, 1 accepted the compensation offered by the contractor and received the compensation payment on the same day. On the other hand, the 12 other farmers rejected the compensation offered by the contractor; they objected to the base reference of the percentage of land productivity that was used in the assessment of losses. The contractor used 2019 Central Bureau of Statistics data. Based on that data, 1 hectare of plantation farm could produce 19 tons. However, the farmers claimed that the land at Pad 9 could produce 27 – 35 tons per hectare. The contractor and PMU agreed to meet again in January 2024 to resolve the issue (See **Appendix 10** for a list of these complaints).

47. There were no complaints lodged in December 2023.

48. **<u>EMA report</u>**. The PMC national social safeguard specialist in November 2023 submitted to the PMU her comments and suggested revisions to the third draft of the EMA's monitoring report.

2. New LAR Activities in July-December 2023, Dieng 2

49. <u>Public Consultation and Participation</u>. PMU, assisted by PMC, carried out 4 public consultations and meetings in Dieng 2 during July-December 2023. Two of these activities were emergency safety drills, while the other 2 were related to the enhancement of the livelihoods of residents and AHs. On board during the emergency drills (one on hazards relative to volcanoes, and another on hydrogen sulfide leak and exposure) were representatives from the Badan Penanggulangan Bencana Daerah/BPBD (Regional Disaster Management Agency). A total of 127 persons participated in the consultations and drills, including 98 women and 29 men. (See **Appendix 11** for a list of the consultations and drills held in Dieng 2 Subproject).

50. **ADB Loan Review Mission**. PMC social safeguard team actively took part in the 2-10 October 2023 ADB Loan Review Mission. Specific to social safeguard, the social safeguard team assisted its counterpart in the PMU in briefing the Mission on the status of LAR, public participation, and gender concerns relative to the Dieng 2 Subproject. Likewise, the social safeguard team joined the site inspections of various Dieng 2 facilities, took part in consultations held by the Mission with various stakeholders, and attended the Mission's wrap-up meeting. Table below gives a summary of the status of agreed actions relative to the Dieng 2 Subproject during the October ADB mission, some of which were carry-overs from the March 30323 ADB mission.

C. Patuha 2

1. LAR Activities Carried-over from the January-June 2023 SSMR

51. <u>Due Diligence Report on the Replacement Forestland at Sugihmukti Village</u>. PMC on 28 November 2023 submitted to PMU the revised DDR per 1 October 2023 comments of ADB. The revised DDR included the TOR of the EMA for Patuha 2 Replacement Forestland. PMU on 4 December 2023 endorsed the DDR to ADB.

52. Earlier on 3 July 2023, PMU paid the cash tax refunds of 9 AP landowners through their respective bank accounts. Also, PMU on 31 July 2023 and 1 August 2023 delivered the in-kind tax refunds of the 27 AP landowners at their homes. However, PMC in the first week of October 2023 realized that the value of the in-kind tax refunds received by 11 of the AP landowners were less than the amounts of their tax deductions. Upon learning about this, PMU in consultation with the APs procured additional inputs and delivered these at the homes of the affected people.

53. <u>Livelihood Restoration Program</u>. PMC on 6-7 November 2023 at Sugihmukti Village conducted in-depth interview of each of the 26 owner-farmer AHs, 2 farm hires, and a lessee displaced by the Patuha Unit 2 replacement forestland for the purpose of preparing an LRP framework for them. The first draft of the LRP framework for Patuha 2 Replacement Forestland AHs was submitted to PMU on 13 November 2023. PMC on 19 December 2023 submitted to PMU the revised LRP framework per 16 November 2023 comments of ADB.

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2. New LAR Activities in July-December 2023, Patuha 2

54. <u>Public Consultation and Participation</u>. PMU, assisted by PMC, carried out 11 public consultations and coordination meetings in July-December 2023. Two of these activities were community safety awareness drills in connection with the drilling activities of the contractor at PTH-U-6A and PTH-H-2C, while the rest were related to enhancing the livelihoods of residents and AHs. A total of 231 persons participated in those consultations and drills, including 141 women and 90 men. (See **Appendix 12** for a list of the consultations and drills held in Patuha 2 Subproject).

55. <u>**Complaint**</u>. One complaint was lodged by Pak Ade Supianto on 18 November 2023 in connection with the transport by the contractor of its equipment that allegedly damaged the road at Panundaan Village. As of the end of December 2023, the PMU, contractor, and the aggrieved party have not yet reached an agreement to resolve the issue.

56. **ADB Loan Review Mission**. PMC social safeguard team actively took part in the 2-10 October 2023 ADB Loan Review Mission. Table below provides the status of agreed actions in connection with Patuha 2 Subproject during the October ADB mission.

VII. Unfinished LAR Activities for Completion in January-June 2024

A. Dieng 2

57. Below are outstanding LAR concerns in Dieng 2 that require addressing in January-June 2024.

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- Clearing of the Dieng 2 power plant (pad 12) RP. A delay in ADB's concurrence to the RP will likewise delay the implementation of the LRP. It is understood, though, that the RP cannot be implemented just the same without a new leasehold agreement (IPPKH) with MOEF. GDE can only commence applying for a renewal of the current IPPKH of the ±0.77 ha plot of pad 12, including the ±2.78 ha expansion area needed for the power plant, after it gets approval of the AMDAL (environmental impact assessment) for Dieng 2. Application and approval of the IPPKH is estimated to take 2 months (in other words, around May 2024 if the AMDAL is approved in February 2024).
- LRP. The LRP frameworks for AHs of pad 12, pad 7 and pad 9 (2021 Dieng 2 RP), and pad 38 (2019 Dieng 2 RP) need ADB's concurrence before they can be implemented. While waiting for ADB clearance to implement the LRPs, PMU should hire without further delay the Third Party that will finalize with the participating AHs the details of the program.
- 3. GRM. The bespoke GRM for Dieng 2 needs to be operationalized. Parties involved in the various levels of the GRM need to be oriented on the new GRM, in addition to maintaining logbooks and keeping GRM forms at the PMU project site and the contractor's office. Moreover, PMU needs to earnestly follow-up with management the issuance of a decree to enforce the new GRM.
- 4. **Complaints**. The 13 complaints filed in November 2023 alleging that well testing activities at pad SLR-T-9C damaged the farmers' potato farms need to be resolved without further delay.

B. Patuha 2

58. Below are outstanding LAR concerns in Patuha 2 that require addressing in January-June 2024.

- 1. **DDR for Replacement Forestland**. PMU on 4 December 2023 endorsed the DDR to ADB.
- LRP. PMC on 19 December 2023 submitted to PMU the revised LRP framework per 16 November 2023 comments of ADB. While waiting for ADB clearance to implement the LRP, the PMU should hire without further delay the Third Party that will finalize with the participating AHs the details of the program.
- 3. **Complaint**. The complaint filed by Pak Ade Supianto alleging that the transport of the contractor's equipment damaged the road at Panundaan Village needs to be resolved without further delay.

IX. Conclusion
